WHAT SORT OF ASSESSMENTS ARE THERE?

Students complete written assignments and also plan a strategy to address a relevant problem of personal interest. There are no exams.

Fees are set by the University each year. You should also plan to pay for your travel costs and to find accommodation when attending your block course.

WHEN IS IT?

A block course will be held early in each semester.

Semester One starts in March and includes COMH801 and COMH803.

Semester Two starts in July and includes COMH801, COMH802 and COMH804.

We ask you to come with a problem/issue/interest in mind that you can solve or improve.

You'll need a normal internet connection that can cope with a visual interface.
